### **Friday, November 2nd** **Depart 8:00am**

Head north with us and see **Montezuma Castle National Monument**. One of the oldest national monuments in the country, it was established in 1905. This is a great illustration of pre-Columbian living in the Southwest.

Next, the Red Rocks of **Sedona**! Visit the **Chapel of the Holy Cross** for panoramic photos of Sedona's 2000 foot sheer cliffs. In Uptown Sedona, there will be time for lots of pictures as well as browsing among the dozens of interesting galleries and shops.

### **Lunch in Sedona**

We'll explore deep into **Oak Creek Canyon** on scenic Route 89A, seeing the splendor of the north side of Sedona.



Take a step back in time with us when we visit **Jerome**, where copper was king and mining towns were teeming in the wild and woolly territorial days of Arizona. A boom town gone bust, Jerome boasted a population of more than 15,000 at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Then in the 1950s, it became a ghost town. Today, its houses and hotels have been converted into many shops, galleries, and restaurants.

### **Tuzigoot National Monument**

Crowning a desert hilltop is an ancient pueblo. From a roof top a child scans the desert landscape for the arrival of traders, who are due any day now. What riches will they bring? What stories will they tell? Will all of them return? From the top of the Tuzigoot Pueblo it is easy to imagine such an important moment. Tuzigoot is an ancient village or pueblo built by a culture known as the Sinagua. The pueblo consisted of 110 rooms including second and third story structures. The first buildings were built around A.D. 1000. The Sinagua were agriculturalists with trade connections that spanned hundreds of miles. The people left the area around 1400.
